Todd DeZoort is Professor and Accounting Advisory Board Fellow in the Culverhouse School of Accountancy at The University of Alabama. He received his Ph.D. from The University of Alabama in 1995 and returned to Tuscaloosa after six years at the University of South Carolina. Todd teaches auditing, corporate governance, and fraud risk management at the undergraduate and graduate levels. He also teaches doctoral seminars in accounting research methods and behavioral accounting research, and served as Director of the Ph.D. Program in Accounting from 2001-2003. His research interests focus primarily on experimental methods and involve audit committee effectiveness and auditor pressure effects. Todd has published articles in a variety of research journals, including *Accounting, Organizations and Society*, *Contemporary Accounting Research*, *Auditing: A Journal of Practice & Theory*, *Journal of Accounting Literature*, *International Journal of Auditing*, and *Behavioral Research in Accounting*.

He serves as Associate Editor for the *Journal of Forensic Accounting* and as a member of the Editorial Board at the *Accounting, Auditing & Accountability Journal*, the *International Journal of Auditing* and *Issues in Accounting Education*. Todd also is a co-author of the *21st Century Governance and Financial Reporting Principles for U.S. Public Companies*, produced in cooperation with the Corporate Governance center and recently endorsed by the Institute of Internal Auditors. He has received numerous research, teaching, and service awards at the university, college, and departmental levels.
