B.A. in Economics

- Students entering the program after fall 2007 (EC 078 or EC 097) are required to take M 100, BUS 201, ACC 200 (and 8 hours of free electives)
- Students who entered prior to fall 2007 (EC036) are not required to take M 100, BUS 201, ACC 200 (requires 15 hours of free electives).

B.S. in Economics

- General degree
- Concentration in Business Economics
- Greater study of analytical economics concepts. Science and math sequence. Fewer humanities and social science courses required.

- For B.S.(ECS+ECB)- 12 hours, 6 hours must be at 400 or 500 level. ECB students must also complete a Financial Economics Elective and an International Economics Elective as a part of their 12 hour elective requirement.

- Students no longer have a PIN. Each student has an academic hold which must be released by an academic advisor.
 - Holds will be released following Advising Sessions

Enrollment Appointments

- Each student is assigned an Enrollment Appointment
 - Appointment includes the date and the time of registration
- How to access your appointment:
 - Go to the “For Students” tab in MyPack
 - Click on Enrollment
 - Click on Enrollment Date
