Program Overview

The North Carolina State University College of Management, in Raleigh, N.C. - in partnership with the Université Paul Cézanne Graduate School of Management (IAE) in Aix-en-Provence, France - is offering a new master's degree in Global Innovation Management, beginning with fall 2008. Students in the program will come from around the world and classes will be held in both France and the United States.

This one-year program awards two master's degrees: a degree from NC State University and a degree from the Université Paul Cézanne. The curriculum is designed to give engineering, science and other technology-oriented students a strong exposure to core business management skills while providing in-depth exposure to a host of global innovation management issues.

Students will be taught by international professors who are leaders in their fields. Interactions with global firms will occur both in the classroom and via internships. The Master in Global Innovation Management was designed to respond to a growing need identified by U.S. and international companies, who report that they are seeking: "technically trained graduates who have a global perspective, who can think outside the box, and who can make an immediate, positive impact at our company."

The school has 40 permanent faculty members, and invites more than 30 international professors and 150 business speakers each year to conduct lectures and courses within the various programmes.
